Formation of the Australian Accordion Teachers Association (AATA): The AATA, a corresponding member of the CIA, was formed ten years ago with the aim to promote the accordion in Australia, improve the accordion standard in Australia, bring Internationally recognized accordionists to perform in Australia and hold regular concerts, seminars and workshops.

AATA Annual Competition: The AATA held its 10th Australian International Accordion Championships and Festival in Sydney on the 29th and the 30th of May, 2004 at the "Ninavah" Sports and Community Club, Edensor Park, Sydney.

The main attraction of the event was a Gala Concert which featured International Guest Artist Pavel Mangassarian, the winner of the CIA International Competition for Piano Accordion. His Australian appearance was part of his prize for winning that cateogry.

Pavel Mangasarian of Russia performed a variety program that had the enthusiastic audience on their feet applauding. Also appearing at the Gala Concert was the ASA Orchestra directed by Elizabeth Jones.

Another concert highlight during the festival was a lovely accordion quartet group from Beijing, China which were very well received by the audience.
