News from Luxembourg...

The UGDA since 1863: In Luxembourg competition for singing and music associations took place as early as 1852.

Since no official federation existed, the government assigned the composer and conductor Jean Antoine Zinnen the task of organizing the competition.

On 6th September 1863 the City Hall in Luxembourg formed the "Luxemburger Music Association" with the goal of promoting musical celebrations, concerts competitions and meetings.

After King Grand Duke William III died on 23 November 1890. Duke Adolphe of Nassau became the Grand Duke of Luxembourg shortly after which the "Luxemburger Music Association" was renamed the "Adolf Federation." With the Federation's assistance a great population of world class musicians emerged into the 20th Century.

This was interrupted during the assault on Luxembourg during the war which began on 10 May 1940, when nearly all activities of musical associations halted. However on 27 January 1946 the federation resumed activities again and in 1947 the "union became Grand-Duc Adolphe."

Today, with 17,400 active members from 327 societies the Union Grand-Duc Adolphe is nowadays the largest Luxembourg music federation for choral artists and instrumentalists.
