D. "Generation Z"

- DEPENDENT ON THE INTERNET FOR SOCIAL INTERACTION.
- 2. Loss of interest in making their own music for family gatherings
- 3. Emphasis on music/art in school classrooms decreased except for band at sports events.
- 4. Emphasis on SPORTS as primary extra-curricular activity.
- 5. Expectation that "learning to play an instrument" will be instant success resulting in discouragement/depression
- 6. Overwhelming exposure to "SOCIAL MEDIA"
- 7. Loss of concept of/desire to SERVE OTHERS —

E. "Gen Alpha" – born 2013 – 2025.

- APPROPRIATE USE OF TECHNOLOGY
 - a. Use of video recording (Smart Phones/I-Pads) in lessons
 - b. Use of electronic metronome as an aid in the development of rhythm skills
 - c. Use of recorded musical examples to aid in home practice

- 4. USE MUSICAL EXAMPLES THAT STUDENTS CAN UNDERSTAND DON'T OVERWHELM WITH COMPLEX IDEAS THAT COMBINE MANY CONCEPTS
 - a. Introduce ONE MUSICAL IDEA at a time!
 - b. Be certain that each concept is mastered before moving on to the next or combining multiple ideas.
 - c. Don't ASSUME UNDERSTANDING.
- 5. STUDENTS WITH "SPECIAL NEEDS"
 - a. Who are they?
 - b. **Every** student has some type of special, unique learning need
 - I. Commonly recognized "disABILITIES" = DIFFERENT ABILITIES
 - II. Gifted and Talented students have just as many (or more) special needs as those who are cognitively and/or physically challenged.
 - III. Unseen DIFFERENT ABILITIES
