CHORD FORM RULES FOR BUILDING THESE CHORDS FROM THE NOTES IN THE HOME MAJOR SCALES.

MAJOR CHORD 1 3 5 SCALE TONES ARE USED. MINOR CHORD 1 3b 5 tones DOMINANT 7TH 1 3 5 7b

DIMINISH 7TH CHORDS 1 3b 5b 7bb[6]

MAJOR 7TH 1 3 5 7TH TONES

MINOR 7TH 1 3b 5 7b

MAJOR 6TH CHORDS 1 3 5 6
